



Are you interested in a summer training position with a federal government position?

The US Forest Service has several new summer internships available through The Environmental Careers Organization (ECO). Read on for a brief description of each position. If you are available for a 12 week internship this summer and have interest in a particular area, please respond by email with your resume and cover letter to apply for the positions.

All positions are \$400 per week stipend, with \$300 relocation assistance. In addition, \$1,000 is available where housing is not provided.

#1: FS - Big Valley Ranger District Intern, California (2 positions available)

- Locate field plots using a variety of techniques.
- Measure plant coverage within plots.
- Gather and prepare field samples. (These samples may involve entomological, sivicultural, seed, fire recreation or an array of scientific disciplines utilized throughout the Forest Service). *Prior knowledge of this is not required*

Qualifications:

- Practical knowledge of methods and techniques of forestry to perform work in the specific areas to which assigned.
- Knowledge of procedures used in gathering and recording field data.
- Skill in identifying common species of plants.
- Knowledge of forestry practices and techniques used in the assigned area to select and adapt procedures to meet specific field conditions.
- *This job requires you to drive a Government vehicle. You must hold a valid State driver's license.*

#2: FS - Fisheries Intern - could be in Montana, North Idaho, North Dakota, or South Dakota

#6 – FS - Warner Mountain Range Technician - Modoc National Forest, Southern Sierra Nevada / Cedarville, California

The primary duties are to conduct field monitoring of livestock use and to observe livestock locations, and report these findings to the District Rangeland Management Specialist. This work is generally conducted alone, requiring driving on low standard roads, walking in arduous terrain, and sometimes traveling horseback. The intern will complete written documentation of their observations. Requires some plant identification skills, low standard road driving competency, and ability to work in the woods alone. Horse riding skills are not an absolute necessity, though extremely useful.

#7 – FS - Timber Technician – Ely, Nevada

Intern will learn how various biological and physical elements work together and include the following:

- Learn to identify tree, shrub, and grass species, and how to collect data on natural vegetation.
- Inventory and record vegetation data using Common Stand Exam (CSE) procedures. Involves random plot, fixed radius, and collecting general plot data (slope, aspect, ground vegetation), and specific tree data (height, crown, damage, defect, etc) on each tree
- Inspect CSE data rec'd from contractor
- Assist Natural Resource Officer in layout and preparation of commercial firewood sales

Qualifications:

- Must be in good physical shape to climb steep mountains
- Willingness to work in hot and dry conditions daily
- Would be nice *but not required* to have some natural resource knowledge, especially forestry, but also good experience for wildlife biologist, ecologist, or environmental scientist
